It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas.... every year it seems our lives become more and more filled with holiday tasks that seem to overwhelm even the most organized person. We become busy decorating, going to holiday concerts, parties, preparing for children Christmas activities, buying presents and so much more. But did you ever stop to think about what life is like for an elderly person? They too once were that active person when they felt their life was on a merry-go-round during the holidays. The holiday season can be a time when older adults feel lonely, isolated or sad. Did you know that over 27% of adults age 65+ live alone. But a person doesn't have to live alone to feel lonely. Loneliness can affect anyone who doesn't feel meaningful connections with other people.

I have challenged everyone this trimester to create a new family holiday tradition. Consider this new tradition to include something to brighten an elderly relative or neighbors holiday season. Some older adults may go for days without speaking to anyone. Nothing beats an inperson visit, but if that isn't possible consider a video chat or just a simple phone call. Make a point to reach out to them on or right before Christmas Day so they don't feel as though they have been forgotten. Get the whole family involved — assign family members a day to visit or call your "adopted" person. Simple things such as a plate of fresh baked cookies, or an offer to give them a ride to the department/grocery store are greatly appreciated. There is nothing more rewarding than watching their eyes light up when taking them for a drive to look at the holiday light displays.

My wish is for you to extend a hand of fellowship this holiday season.

Requesting Points of Something:

Point of Order: Draws attention to a breach of rules, improper procedure, breaching of established practices, etc.

Point of Information: A member may need to bring up an additional point or additional information (in the form of a non debatable statement) so that the other members can make fully informed votes.

Point of Inquiry: A member may use point of inquiry to ask for clarification in a report to make better voting decisions.

Point of Personal Privilege: A member may use point of personal privilege to address the physical comfort of the setting such as temperature or noise. Members may also use it to address the accuracy of published reports or the accuracy of a member's conduct.

Exciting things are happening in the Membership Management Committee!

Our Membership Wings taskforce has just finished creating a sustainable way to track members passing and recognize those that passed during the WT year at annual convention. In the next month chapters will be getting more information on this process in the official MNWT chapter emails.

A new orientation deck that focuses on the district and state organization is now available. Much like the local chapter orientation deck introduced last year is customizable to your chapter, the district and state presentation is fully customizable to your unique district happenings.

And we have introduced a 10-minute orientation series for chapters to use to educate all members on different areas of Women of Today. These are simple short trainings that can be done by anyone. Consider having a mini orientation at one or two of your general meetings each trimester. The first four available are MNWT Programming, Parli Basics, USWT, and Membership Growth, ROAR.

Did you know MMC supports all areas of MNWT Membership? We recently held a zoom on Extension. A few fun extension tidbits...

- · MNWT has an extensions guide that goes over all forms needed, and the process of forming a chapter including bylaw and policy templates.
- An extension needs 10 new members not including transfers. Only the new members will be charter members, not the transfers.
- · With a 10 and under chapter both new members and transfers count towards their 10 members.
- Once an extension has 10 members and the paperwork is completed they charter right away and are a new chapter. For the next two years they work with the extensions team, starting small to run monthly meetings and hold events and socials. They graduate 2 years later.

MMC is always looking for new ideas. Consider attending our March meeting to learn more.

#### <u>Chairman of the Board</u> Continued

As we head towards celebrating our 75th Anniversary at Winter State, here is more on the first years of Mrs. Jaycees/Jaycee Women/Women of Today:

**1966**-Louise Gass of Northfield was elected the 17th president. 16 regions boasted 130 chapters and membership was at 2705. Internal and External Vice Presidents were appointed. The chaplain's position was given to an Executive Council member. Two state chairmanships were added – Tips for Talks and Membership. \$4145 was raised for Cystic Fibrosis, tours of state institutions were initiated, and the Indian Scholarship project was dropped. Permanent files were purchased for the offices of President, External and RTR (Recognition through Records) chair. Jaycee and Mrs. Jaycees began scheduling joint meetings. Dues billings due date was changed to October 1.

1967-Barbara DeLaHunt of North St. Paul was our next leader. Growth continued with 137 chapters and 18 regions making up our organization. Duties for Internal and External VPs were established. Forums were added at conventions; one of the first of many to come entitled "Taxes and the Minnesota Mrs. Jaycees" was held when sales tax first began. Written reports were new, and a state membership contest began. "On to Phoenix" was the theme for National Convention with Minnesota promoting books as favors. Delinquent Youth was added as a programming area and Christmas and summer parties were held for Cystic Fibrosis families. Barbara was also invited to speak at many Jaycee functions and went on to become the National Liaison Officer for the United States Jaycee Auxiliaries.

1968 -The metro area provided us with Joan Swenson of Wayzata for the next state president. Membership of 2919, 19 regions and 147 chapters were boasted. The Distinguished Service Awards meeting became known as TOYM-Ten Outstanding Young Men, a winter event. The title "Chairman of the Board" became official. Forums were enlarged to allow each state chairman to bring information to the membership. Professional, "in the field" people, conducted forums. The membership brochure was revised and reprinted with references to dates and places removed, making the brochures more usable. Manuals and judges were compiled for competitions and a publication of our history was updated. Spokette -Sparkette was adopted on a trial basis. (We now know this a STEP I, II, III & IV). The sailor outfit was back again at National Convention-minus the big wheel hat. Convention Registration Full \$14.95, Partial \$10.75, Hotel Rooms: Double \$14.00 each

1969-Jackie Johnson of Bloomington led us as the decade ended. The Flame of Hope candle brought us Muriel Humphrey as honorary chairman. Proceeds of the project went to assist us in bringing a boathouse building to Camp Friendship. Betty Crocker points coupons were used to pay for the power lines into the camp. Dues were raised to \$2.50 per member. The president's budget was \$550. Jackie stated that "there was no uniform-'69 and '70 were non-conformist years!" The organization also hosted a reception for the premiere of the movie "Airport", which was filmed in the Twin Cities.

**1970**-Bette (Blain) Woods of South St. Paul served us next as state president. It was during her year that the Windom chapter proposed a new program, kidney disease. The Delinquent Youth project was renamed a more positive Accent on Youth. Springfield's chapter urged our membership to correspond with the astronauts and thank them for their service while in space.

"One small problem of which I am sure you are all aware is the lack of understanding by the local officers of just how important their job is to the chapter....and how very important it is to start the year off right...In an effort to solve this problem a team has been put together to give forums on local president, state delegate, secretary and treasurer."

Filing for state president and state staff begins on December 1st. A reminder that if you are thinking about it, I should be the one to contact. When asking for support from your chapter, be sure to go into a committee of the whole and that is not included in your minutes. Check the bylaws and policies for the requirements for these positions. There are also committee chairs, committee members, NEWSLET Editor, Public Relations Assistant, and Success Coordinator to file for. Contact me with any questions on any of the areas.

We will be celebrating 75 years as an organization at Winter State! Several of the past presidents are working hard to make it an awesome event! There will be a memorabilia room, a special celebration activity at the luncheon and there are special 15 oz wine glasses for sale to commemorate our 75 years as the Mrs. Jaycees/Jaycee Women/Women of Today. Continue to watch the Minnesota Women of Today Facebook page for the Countdown series – it has been fun to share the history!
