### <u>Amy Pumper</u> <u>Chairman of the Board</u>

As we head towards celebrating our 75 th Anniversary at Winter State, here is more on the beginning of our organization:

1956 -Working hard to chart new direction this year was Carol Pazandak of Minneapolis. With 12 new extensions and a total of 50 chapters, we encountered many new things— the state was divided into five regions, Executive Council was instituted, roll call balloting was accepted. Each region elected its own Regional Vice President at a separate meeting and Mrs. Jaycees of Minnesota became an incorporated non-profit organization. Individual NEWSLET subscriptions were made available for a slight charge and over 400 were requested. This included our agendas, notices of by-law changes, etc. Assistance to the Mentally Retarded was initiated as a new state project as well as the position of "convention coordinator". The first annual report was printed. Gen Mollerud, then convention favor coordinator, managed to get 500 Norway Pine tree seedlings and printed plastic bags for the Milwaukee National Convention. The national convention "uniform" was a navy-blue sailor style dress with white Skipper wheel hats-no, they were not snowflakes as some people thought!

1956-57 Region VII President in her final report,

"I wish every Mrs. Jaycee in MN could have the privilege of visiting other chapters. It was a thrilling experience to meet so many fine wives and mothers taking time to serve their communities; grow individually in knowledge, leadership and maturity; and to join in a fellowship of warm friendliness through Mrs. Jaycee's." Frieda Owen, Austin (Later became

State President).

1957-Leading "Young Women of Action" was Gen Mollerud of Fergus Falls. We now have 58 chapters, and six regions. State committees are now at 12. State officers are reimbursed for 5 cents a mile, up from 3 cents. NEWSLET circulation reached 1000 and each chapter was sent 4 copies– three for state delegates, and one for the local presidents. Additional copies could be ordered for 4 cents each. A new state project, Civil Defense, was adopted under Chairman Dorothy Oatman. Gen's motto was "to make Mrs. Jaycees symbolic of gracious young women everywhere".

1958-Dorothy Oatman of Bloomington reported traveling 12,000 miles during her year. Mrs. Jaycees grew to nearly 70 chapters and we redistricted into seven regions. The "corresponding secretary" and "recording secretary" positions were combined into one appointed office. Financial conditions necessitated dues increase to \$1.00 per member. Plans were begun for a Summer Awards luncheon to be held in the Twin Cities as a "ladies only" event. A thirds tate project of Indian Welfare was adopted after a plea from Lucia Winegar of Duluth. A scholarship fund was established for deserving Indian students and many local projects were established.

1959-Mankato once again provided the state with leadership; this time our president was Betty Hodgkins. With a theme of "Blast off with Betty", flying saucers and a life-size rocket in a parade and at a party, Betty made her mark. Meetings started promptly with Betty, but sometimes didn't end on time. The FIRST Summer Awards luncheon was held in St. Paul. Cystic Fibrosis was adopted as a project and a state parliamentarian was appointed. State chairman bid forms (similar to our current state program manager process) were implemented, past Regional Vice President pins and eight new Jaycee chapters highlighted Betty's year. We celebrated our 10th anniversary and had 9 out of 10 presidents in attendance.

1960 -Southern Minnesota provided the next president—Frieda Owen of Austin. Frieda was known for her big black hat, which made it easy to locate her in a crowded room. Fifteen new chapters were extended. We ended the year with a 15% membership increase and total 85 chapters and 2000 members. We were ranked the largest Jaycee Auxiliary in the United States. There was also a big change in the NEWSLET— it now had pictures, was printed and sent to all members' homes. We again redistricted into nine regions. The Plan of Action was started. A state chaplain was added. We also assisted our Jaycees by serving as official chaperone for Miss Minnesota.

Thank you to my ONTO committee members for all their help with the ONTO table and skit at Fall State – they really did an awesome job! There will be more fun to be had at Winter State and the committee is planning some fun things, so you won't want to miss it! I hope we have an awesome group representing Minnesota at the USWT Mid-Year meeting in Omaha, NE October 10-11 th ! It will be fun to celebrate our first trimester successes and meet with members from other chapters! I look forward to seeing you there!

Make plans to attend Winter State convention in January – we will be celebrating our 75 th Anniversary and the past presidents are working hard to make it an amazing event! More on what is to come soon!

### **Consider an Executive Council Position for 2024-2025!**

When considering a position as district director, state program manager, staff, or even state president, you will want to make an informed decision. Talk to others who have held these positions. Gather information, reflect on your passion and commitment, and determine where your future path might take you. And, in addition, you can always contact me. I will be glad to answer any questions and chat with you as you consider taking the step to be a member of the MNWT Executive Council.

The following information is intended to help guide you in your decision-making process:

### **District Director:**

Administrative Vice President, Andrea Schue and your current district director can provide insight and information to help guide your decision and desire to serve as DD. By filling this vital role and communication link between the state organization and the local chapters, we can ensure districts and chapters are off to a successful start in the new year and remain well informed while on their journeys to success. Most districts elect their DD at their spring district meeting. Make your decision early to allow plenty of time for planning as you prepare to become a DD.

### State Program Manager:

Contact Programming Vice President, Michelle Kocak-Jones and the current SPM in the area (s) for which you might be interested. Ask, seek, and gather information from them to help you decide on bidding for an SPM position. They can assist you with the paperwork as you prepare your bid for the Winter State Convention.

### Staff/State President:

Step right up! I can answer your questions and help guide you through the process of deciding whether a staff position is right for you. Staff positions are selected by the presidential candidate (s) and their staff selection process has many facets (i.e., experience, location, interest in position). By filing for staff and indicating your interest, you are placing your name in the forefront for consideration. Confidentiality is important should you decide to seek a staff position, and your intent should only be shared with the Chair of the Elections committee (aka Chairman of the Board) at this time.

December 1, 2024 is the earliest date that you may file your intent with the chairman of the board.
