#### <u>Amy Pumper</u> <u>Chairman of the Board</u>

As we head towards celebrating our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary at Winter State, here is more on the beginning of our organization:

In 1951 -June (Ogle) Lees of Mankato served as our state president and her husband, Art, served as the Jaycee state president– in the same year! As the organization concentrated primarily on keeping the members active and interested, they also focused on extensions. There were six state committees, each assigned to a chapter. The organization felt the need for a creed to define the group and give an aim and purpose. Each chapter was encouraged to submit ideas and five did. So, the Virginia chapters' creed was accepted and is still used today. Nine new chapters joined the organization, bringing the chapter member number up to 17. Proposed Operating State Budget for the year: Expenses \$107.88, Income \$137.

1952 -This year was a trying one; one that Delores (Maase) Templeton of Minneapolis would long remember. Minneapolis hosted the National Jaycee convention in June and being the true Mrs. Jaycees that we were, we were right there– ready, willing and able– assisting the Jaycees. As a moneymaker a Paul Bunyanland cookbook was put together, and these were sold as National Convention souvenirs. The national delegation had its own "uniform"- green shirts, red skirts and red hats were the uniform."This year because of the unprecedented polio incidence, it is essential that the 1953 March of Dimes Mothers March in January be successful...It is my sincere hope that our organization will make a substantial contribution to the March of Dimes......" Mrs. Delores Masse, President Mrs. Jaycees 12/52

1953 -Several FIRSTS will be remembered as a part of Betty Gerth's year. This president, from Pipestone, was at the helm when several new initiatives happened– the first roster– using a small, mimeographed booklet with the names and addresses of chapter officers. The first statewide service project, Toys and Joys, was adopted. This project continued for four more years. A Distinguished Service Award was also given. This recognized an outstanding Mrs. Jaycee member. Later this award was presented to three outstanding chapters and for several years an Outstanding State Chairman Award was also presented. Another first was the implementation of the Lady Mile trophy. Mrs. Jaycees now boasts 23 chapters.

1954 - Mankato had the distinction of being the first chapter to give us a second state president– Bette Koeppen. Bette was the first state president to have three regional vice presidents to assist her. The voting procedures for our organization were changed for the first time. In addition to "Toys and Joys", we added the Assistance to the Mentally Retarded project, which was to be permanently adopted in 1956. They grew from 22 chapters to 31 this year. This year marked our first year of working with the March of Dimes in the fight against polio. A big addition to the organization was the purchase of a typewriter. 1955 -Shirley (Schwartz) Barenbaum of Hibbing served as our next state president. She had been one of the three VPs to serve the previous year under Bette. Shirley remembers much enthusiasm and the importance of spreading the Mrs. Jaycee message and name as highlights. The National Convention was held in Kansas City and once again, we assisted the Jaycees by supplying 3500 paperweights to be used as convention souvenirs. Programming areas under consideration were Civil Defense, Miss J. C. (Junior Citizen) and Children's Home Society. This was also the year the first mimeograph machine died.

Have you ordered your ONTO Shirt yet? Contact me if you need the form. Orders are due September 5<sup>th</sup> for you to pick up at convention. There will be some available for sale at Fall State, but it is better to order ahead to ensure you get the size you need.

Do you have ONTO shirts laying around that you would like to share? An ONTO shirt quilt will be made for members to buy chances at Winter State. Shirts need to be to me by Fall State. I have quite a few – let's see how many more we can get!

Make plans to attend USWT Midyear meeting in Omaha, NE October 11-12, 2024. The registration form is online. It is sure to be bushels of fun!
