<u>Amy Pumper</u> Chairman of the Board

As we head towards celebrating our 75 th Anniversary at Winter State, here is more on the beginning of our organization:

1961-Marilyn King of White Bear Lake was the president. With a campaign chant of "Join the Swing, vote for King", she kicked off the year. Mrs. Jaycees were officially recognized in the Minnesota Jaycee State Bylaws. The debate also began with focus on the Mrs. Jaycees Bylaws, specifically the section on membership being limited to only wives of active or associate Jaycee men and that these women must be under 36 years of age. We reached 2100 members and 93 chapters. An extension kit and membership brochures were revised, and a membership drive was initiated. Convention planning was a duty given to the State First Vice President and the chairman of the board was assigned the supervision of the regional vice presidents. The awards program was revised, and the name "Recognition through Records" was accepted. "Onto Las Vegas" buttons were sold for a National Convention fundraiser and 1000 turkey sandwiches were given as a favor at convention. A second uniform, navy blue culottes and a white blouse, was adopted for casual wear.

1962- "Here's the Key, Vote for Marie" was the election slogan of Marie Cavers of Virginia. This historic year had three women vying for state president. Many new goals were met—2300 members, 96 chapters, our NEWSLET went to a newsprint format with an increase in size and addition of pictures. Three six-page issues were printed. All past state presidents were made honorary member of Mrs. Jaycees, receiving the NEWSLET free of charge. The tradition of inviting all past state presidents to Summer Awards was instituted. The Central Mailing System (what we now know as Chapter Mailing) was implemented and minutes of state meetings were included. This system is still being used and all chapters receive one copy, with additional ones available for a small cost. Dues were increased to \$1.50/member. Marie had a baby during her term-daughter Lisa Anna, born just before the Fall meeting.

Information in the National Jaycee Auxiliary Manual revealed that the Mrs. Jaycees of Minnesota is the largest Jaycee Auxiliary in the United States.

1963- "Flower with Nauer" was the campaign slogan that South St. Paul's Priscilla Nauer used. Priscilla's Executive Council will always remember receiving a floral roll of bathroom tissue to help them continue to "Flower with Nauer". We reached 103 chapters, but membership dropped to 2100. A new leadership training committee was formed, and a portion of the Civil Defense project introduced a medical self-help Child protection segment. The Indian scholarship program reached \$1900. Minnesota Association for Retarded Children purchased a camp near Annandale (Camp Friendship) and Minnesota made a substantial contribution toward its purchase. NEWSLET used colored print for the first time-some rather startling ink colors-lime and fuchsia. Priscilla was also a charter member of the Women of Today Foundation and instrumental in its organization.

12-3-63 Dear Mrs. Nauer:

Nothing has meant more to me during these hours of sorrow after the death of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy than the messages from friends like you. I appreciate your thoughtfulness. I shall cherish your prayers in the days ahead.

1964 - Hastings provided our next state leader with Darlene Hallberg. She ended her year with 109 chapters and 2260 members. The Child Protection program was enhanced and adopted. A tour of the camp in Annandale was offered to our members and a tour of the Cystic Fibrosis Research Center at the U of M was offered. Three Native American students received some college financial support. Extension kits were revised, state chairman (program manager today) reports were initiated, and a debate section was added to our leadership section. Darlene's year was highlighted by the opportunity to speak about Minnesota's leadership at the Iowa convention.

1965 - Gerry Troland of Moorhead served as our next president, logging in at 11,396 miles traveled. The chapter base grew by 14 and at year end 122 chapters were divided into 14 regions. "Tips for Talks" program was initiated, and we now use this basis for our Effective Speaking competition. Regional and state competitions were held. Service projects were developed and \$5370 in contributions was reported. Our state project was Aid to Retarded Children. Cystic Fibrosis detection clinics were held in 25 Minnesota sites with 14,000 children tested. Four Native American students received financial support and Stranger Danger Slides were made available to chapters. ID bracelets and the medical self-help courses were popular.

What a great time 25 members and guests had at the USWT Mid-Year meeting the weekend of October 11-12 in Omaha, Nebraska! There were many awards for members and chapters — stay tuned for all the excitement as it rolls out by President Tevyan and CMVP Shirley. It isn't too early to plan to attend USWT Annual Convention, June 13-14 th in Duluth where we will be celebrating the USWT 40 th Anniversary!

At Winter State convention in January – we will be celebrating our 75 th Anniversary and the past presidents are working hard to make it an amazing event! There will be a memorabilia room, a special celebration activity at the luncheon and there are special 15 oz wine glasses for sale to commemorate our 75 years as the Mrs. Jaycees/Jaycee Women/ Women of Today. I hope you are enjoying the Countdown posts on Minnesota Women of Today Facebook page.
