Why do we?...

I was asked at Annual why we vote to send the Minnesota Women of Today delegation uncommitted to national convention. We do this because we may learn new information about things that need to be voted on (bylaws and policies for example) and that could make a difference in how the members feel we need to vote to ensure it is the best thing for our organization.

Another fact you might be interested in is: Just like chapters get a certain number of votes at conventions based on the number of members, so do the states. Due to having 924 members, currently, our state is allowed five votes:

ONTO Committee

What is ONTO? It is a committee that promotes attendance at US Women of Today conventions, provides fundraising and assistance for those attending national conventions. There are several activities held during the year beginning at Fall State. We have ONTO Shirt fundraiser – pre-orders are being taken (see the order form later in this CIP) and will be delivered at Fall State. We will be collecting ONTO Shirts from the past to have a quilt made that we will sell chances to win in recognition of the 75th Anniversary, and there will be flower sales for Winter State to benefit the ONTO Committee.

Members Needed

I am looking for members to be a part of the ONTO Committee. This fun committee promotes the USWT Convention attendance as well as holds fundraisers to support our President Tevyan to be able to attend. Members of this committee can help with sales of shirts, quilt chances, Fall State Project Fair, skits and more! This is great way to learn more about the Women of Today especially the USWT and get to know other members.

USWT Buckets of Sunshine

The USWT hosts a Buckets of Sunshine collection in June at their annual convention for a shelter in the area as a way of giving back and helping those individuals and families dealing with Domestic Violence. It is my hope that we can help by collecting items to help the shelters that are helping them.

At the Mid-Year meeting, the hosts of the convention find an organization that would benefit from monetary and/or wish list items in that community (does not have to be DVA related but often is).

We ask members of the MN Women of Today to help out by donating wish list items or making monetary donations. It is a way for us to give back to those communities and possibly get a little public relations for our efforts.

Statewide Committees

What are the Statewide Committees? The Future Directions (FDC), Membership Management (MMC), Marketing, Finance, Bylaw and Policies Committees are where the decisions are where change happens. The MNWT Foundation is a 501@3 organization that supports the Minnesota Women of Today with funding for trainings, speakers, Chapter Service Center needs and so much more.

How often do the Statewide Committees meet? Marketing, MMC, and Future Directions meeting 3 times a year – this year, they will be in July, November and March. In person attendance is recommended but there is an option for Zoom if members cannot make it work to attend in person. Registration starts at 9:30 am with the MMC meeting at 10:00 am followed by Marketing at 11:00 and Future Directions at 1:00 pm with a light lunch provided with a nominal donation to offset costs.


- Contact the Chairman of the Board (me) to RSVP or show up. If you RSVP, it helps us to have enough agendas and other materials and food for all attending

Leadership and Your Chapter

The Leadership task force revamped and refreshed materials we had in place to help chapters with succession planning. These materials can be found on the website (www.mnwt.org) on the left hand column of the homepage. When you click on that link you get the following page:



If you click on the different tabs, you will find great information to help you work with your chapter to bring up leaders in your chapter and beyond. A healthy chapter will help their members to move up in leadership roles within their chapter and not rely on the same members year after year. When members are comfortable in a position and taking it on for more than two years, it can be difficult to bring new leadership up. When that happens, it prevents growth of other members. Those who stay in the position for more than two years can become resentful, dissatisfied and overwhelmed often leading to leaving the chapter and creating chaos.

Allowing members to take on new positions gives them the chance to learn new skills in a safe environment. We encourage Succession Planning because it is a process for identifying people with the potential to fill key leadership roles within the chapter.
