

COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS AWARDS

Civic or Environmental Project

This project brings together the community for an event to show support and appreciation in the community. This project has entertainment and activities by many community groups.

About three years ago, the National Night Out was in danger of being cancelled because of a lack of help. The Avon Women of Today stepped up to keep the event going. The chapter runs the food stand and the kids' games. Through this event the chapter has been recognized as an asset to the community.

The chapter feels privileged to assist with a rewarding community event that helps everyone appreciate the small things that make life in a small community great. Congratulations to the Avon Women of Today, "National Night Out" project for the Civic Project

Joint Ventures Award:

This project brought awareness to the issue of trafficking in the community and how women can empower other women.

The St. Joseph chapter collaborated with local business owners to sponsor a fundraiser for Terebinth Refuge. The speakers at the event included a client of Terebinth Refuge telling her story of survival and recovery, a personal trainer speaking about women's health, MNWT Past-President Jenise Teske about the benefits that Women of Today offers to members to form lasting friendships, find their individual talents and the personal growth.

In addition, members served dinner, cleaned up and distributed marketing materials to businesses. Congratulations to the St. Joseph Chapter's "Terebinth Refuge Fundraiser" for the Joint Venture Award.

Community Impact Award:

This project was a result of a mom reaching out to the chapter with the idea of creating an indoor play experience for kids with stay-at-home parents. The Warroad Area Chapter ran with the idea and created the "Kid Zone at Warroad Community Center" and held on 9 Mondays between March and May.

Funds raised from the Community Bingo were used to rent the Warroad Community Center, purchase activity rugs, bouncy toys, small indoor slide, foam mats, pop-up tunnels, foam blocks, coloring books and crayons, and balance beam pieces that can be rearranged.

The community benefitted from this project because it created an opportunity for kids to socialize with each other, learn to interact with other kids and adults, share toys and play new games and activities. Adult family members benefitted by meeting other adults and gathering ideas for new activities. The group plans to stay connected and schedule play dates at a local park. In April, an article appeared in the Roseau Times Region and the mom who brought the project to Warroad Women of Today became a member. Congratulations to "Kid Zone at Warroad Community Center" for the Community Impact Award.
