Check In on Your Chapter

Congratulations! You are just under one-third of the year left leading your chapter. Your chapter hopefully is progressing forward on your collective goals and you are seeing results. Now is a great time to take a checkpoint and see where you need to put some extra focus or even back off.

Goal Review Take time to review goal progress with either your board or your chapter members. With a few months left in the year, what do you have left that you want to accomplish? Are you making this goal a priority or providing opportunities to make this happen? What activities do you need to meet your goal?

Now What? Do a Trimester Check In.

- Are your board members active? Now can be a great time to get board members involved at a different level. Take the opportunity to ask them to take on a bigger help or to assist you in a new way. This may be just the taste of a new role they need to step up in a new way in the future.
- Do you have a mix of Service, Social & Personal events? Are your members hibernating for winter? There are a number of built-in opportunities to get them involved. Look at M-Week and plan a Random Acts of Kindness event. Plan a Galentines outing for Feb 13 or gather for the Tri 2 webinar. Get inspired by International Women's Day on March 8 or the start of spring on March 20. And plan a chapter service or community project for April 12th joining MNWT chapters all over the state in a Day of Service.
- Are you focusing on recruiting new members AND retaining existing members? While you may feel like you have a good number of members, they come and go and you are best positioned if you are always putting some effort into marketing your chapter.
- Are your members engaged in chapter activities? Member engagement brings energy, resources, and new ideas to the chapter. Make sure that everyone is getting the information about events & meetings in a timely manner. Check in with members...do they like what is being offered or are there other reasons they are not showing up? Let members know they are missed and you need them to participate in the chapter.
- Are your meetings positive and does it feel good to be with your chapter? Shorten the business of the meeting and add an activity like a service project, random act of kindness, craft or a speaker. Support members to bring up questions in a positive way and allow members to express their opinions/ideas. Use an agenda and encourage reports to stick to the facts (Who, What, When, Where & Why). Having well organized activities can feel good. And show appreciation for all who are participating or supporting your chapter!

If answered 'NO' to any of these and need help, please reach out! Myself, the staff, the SPMs and your District Director are all here to support you. We can help you and your chapter finish strong!

Should I repeat as President?

It can be very tempting to repeat as your chapter president when all of your members are saying no and have good reasons. You probably had good reasons for saying no when you were asked as well. However, the transition of leaders and having new people take the reins is good for chapters.

Burnout is real. When you repeat the same position, you can easily fall into a rut where you are going through the motions and not looking for new opportunities for the chapter.

Don't put all of the eggs in one basket. When leaders stay in their position too long, one person becomes to critical and if they need to step away, all chapter momentum can halt. Make sure that there are others that can step into each role so the chapter is not dependent completely on just one.

High bars are not real. When one member leads for too long, the presidency can become daunting to do it like she does. But that is not the case, we all have learning curves and with support other members can do the job and make it her own!

Variety is good. Leadership changes often bring opportunity for new ideas and new approaches, even other new leaders.

Be purposeful in a second tour. Sometimes a second year can be good with an intention. Use this time for training or preparing someone for the next year,

Connecting with the members in your chapter is your most critical role as a chapter president. This comes in many forms. It can be in your communications (or lack thereof), your meetings, attention to details with activities and in your recognition programs. Take an inventory of your touchpoints with your chapter members and evaluate if it is enhancing your members' experiences. How else can you add to their membership that will strengthen their engagement and commitment?

Communication Conundrum

When working with chapters on challenges they are having in their chapter, it often comes down to communication problems. Here are a few situations and things to think about for your chapter.

I didn't know so I did what I thought needed to be done. When working on a project or with a board, make sure there opportunities are We often avoid communicate. even written meetings communications for lack of time but find a way to connect and work together efficiently and effectively. Spending a little time reviewing where you all are and planning next steps can save everyone time in the future.

We covered that at a meeting so no need to cover again. Not all members can make meetings all of the time. Make sure you have a way for them to find out what is going on or to sign up to be involved with activities. This could be as simple as an email after meetings with a quick update and who to contact for each upcoming event or registration/rsvp links.

She knows what she's doing so no need to include others. Providing updates allows for all to learn and also for others to provide input on how that activity or project fits into the chapter big picture. It also gives others a chance to learn and perhaps take on new roles in the chapter.

Whether it is written, face-to-face or via virtual connection, communicating status and planning can avoid unnecessary confusion or stress and provide opportunities to learn and for others to engage.

Retention Reminders

Retaining existing members is key. Existing members are the lifeblood of a chapter and they deserve your time and attention. When you recognize people are hesitant to renew or you see a growing trend, you want to check in and see if there is an issue that can be addressed.

Variety is the spice of life. Change for change's sake is not recommended, but often we all need to mix it up. Ask your members if they need a change. This helps others to learn and not be dependent on one person and keeps a member from getting bored doing the same thing all of the time.

Recognition matters. Even long-time members like to be recognized. It helps to feel valued and can also motivate others. Make sure you spread out the kudos but remember to say "thank you" or "I appreciate you" even when members are doing what they always do.
